


Teachers Cite Reasons For High Morale Here

A survey conducted recently by the Board of Education brought to light many reasons why the morale of the teaching staff of Torrance has been at a high level since this city pulled out of the Los Angeles system, and set up its own district.

Each teacher in the local district was asked to submit reasons why they liked to work here. Each reply was submitted unsigned.

One of the prime reasons for the high morale cited by the teachers was the freedom in teaching allowed here. They said they liked the fact that they were free to use their own methods, that they had opportunities to be creative and that there was no dictatorial interference.

The teachers also cited the quality of administrative supervision as a factor in high morale. The helpful and cordial attitude, and the fact that the administrators did not exert undue pressure on them was lauded by the teachers.

Cooperation between teachers and parents was another reason stressed by many faculty members.

Another paramount reason that makes the Torrance system a popular one in eyes of teachers is the district philosophy that places an emphasis on child development and is not afraid to experiment on new teaching methods.

An adequate salary scale and the district's efforts to continuously improve the pay scale also appeals to the teachers.

Instructors also liked the fact that they are asked to participate in making policy for the school system. They feel that they are an integral part of the system rather than just a hired hand who does exactly what he is told.

All Groups Not Exempt From Tax, Bureau Warns

The new revenue law allows exemption from Federal admissions tax to certain non-profit groups which are exempt from income tax as charitable, religious or educational organizations. The collector of internal revenue points out, however, that many such organizations do not come within the provisions of the new law entitling them to exemption from admissions tax.

The collector's office explains that exemptions from the tax organization merely because it believes that it qualifies as a non-profit organization. In each instance application for exemption must be made on Form 755, and the collector will return to the applicant a Form 775-A, either granting or denying the application.

Many groups, believing that they qualify as exempt from admissions tax as "educational organizations" have forwarded applications.
