Coach Rex Welch's cellar dwelling Tartar cagers take a rest this week, and then start up the long hard second round grind for at least a peek at the Bay League crown. They will tackle the third place Santa Monica team Feb. 8.

The Torrance quint will not compete in the Beverly Hills CIF tourney this week-end, because no invitation was received from tournament bigwigs.

Welch explained that last year because of a league law prohibiting entrance in two tournaments in one year, they refrained from playing in the Beverly competition. This year, they didn't even receive an invitation.

The crew will rest up, then prepare to turn on the steam and climb out of the bog which has surrounded them in their place at the bottom of the circuit, a task which will not be easy, what with the loss of stalwart Jack O'Caïn, who this week turns in his suit for a cap and gown.

O'Caïn has plinked in many needed points in every tilt, and Welch will have to do some mighty clever shifting to fill his sneakers.

In games last week, the Tartars seconded their chance for a stay on the bottom rung as they took a 72-28 drubbing from the league leading Inglewood five, and a 50-40 loss

Services Held For Geo. Fults, Killed In Crash



Warriors Host LBJC; Split Weekend Tilts

El Camino's speedy basketballers face a light one-game schedule this week, as Long Beach JC invades tomorrow night for the final fray of first-round play in the Metropolitan circuit. The game will start at 8 p.m. in the Camino gym.

The Warriors currently boast a 3 win 3 loss mark, and stand midway in the Metro+ league standings. They split a pair, handing Bakersfield a 75-62 defeat, and taking a 80-65 dumping from Harbor, last weekend.

Valley Leads

With one more skirmish before the start of second round play, Valley J. C. is out in front in the Metropolitan Cage circuit by a considerable margin. El Camino is tied 3 and 3, and Harbor rounds out the bottom of the heap.

Camino's sharp-shooting Bob Ross bucketed 17 points, to strengthen his bid as third place scorer in the Metro league. Wayne Scholl chalked up 11 counters, George Bishara 9, and Carrow 8.

Little Bill Shea was the spark-plug of the eye, however, and his ball swiping tactics proved mighty dangerous for Tech.

The Harbor men were making most of their tallies from way-out, and rebounds accounted for only a few scores. Speedy Milt Williams and Willie Carr accounted for 25 of the big points, while Marvin Rucel scored 21 times.

Typical cross-town rivalry flared throughout the session, which accounted for the high number of fouls, especially in the close second period. Shea fouled out in the last minutes of play.

Statistically, Camino tried 70 field goals and made 28, while Tech shot 66 times and completed 32.

Wardens Nab 900 Hunters

More than 900 Californians were nabbed by state game wardens during the month of November, 1951, the greatest number of arrests during any month of their 74-year-old history, the Department of Fish and Game announced this week.

Some 921 sportsmen were cited for various violations. They paid \$31,996 or about \$37.50 per head, and an aggregate of 520 days were spent in jail. Commercial fish valued at \$2131 was confiscated.

Waterfowl violations accounted for the largest number of pinches, with 216 sportsmen apprehended. A new law prohibiting the possession of loaded guns in autos was responsible for over 200 citations being issued.
