Cost of Living Index Lag Halts Clerk Pay Hike

Since the current cost of living index fell short of 190.4, there will be no automatic increase in wages for members of the Retail Clerks Union, Local 905, who are employed in markets and food stores in this area, Frank S. Selover, executive secretary of the Harbor Area Employers Council, revealed yesterday.
The current index is 188.0 or 2.4 under the index set forth in an agreement with the union and local food employers.
Wages will remain at the present level until Nov. 1 of this year, the expiration date of current contracts, Selover said.

City Receives \$4736 Liquor License Funds

Liquor license fee earnings amounting to \$4736.88 were paid to the City of Torrance recently by State Controller Thomas H. Kuchel as part of the state-wide distribution of the funds. It has been announced by William G. Bonelli, Fourth District member of the State Board of Equalization.
The amount of the fees distributed represented earnings during the six months which ended Feb. 29, 1952. The total funds distributed were 4 percent less than last year, Bonelli said.

And be SURE to warn the children to stay away from stray dogs and cats... Once the symptoms of rabies develop whether in humans or animals, the result is death.
