To music lovers in Torrance, as well as in other cities throughout California, the Ojai Festival is a treasured event. This year the festival will take place from May 30 to June 1 and will feature the West Coast premiere of an important work by an outstanding Southern composer, Elinor Remick Warren.

Given its world premiere a year ago, "The Singing Earth" Miss Warren's most recent composition, will be performed in Ojai by Rose Bampton, Metropolitan Opera soprano, with the Ojai Festival Chamber Orchestra under the baton of Tior Johnson.

"The Singing Earth" was inspired by four poems of Carl Sandburg, celebrated American poet.

Also of interest to festivalgoers is the announcement that Rose Bampton will devote the second half of her leader recital May 31 in Northhoff Auditorium to an interpretation of a song cycle by the late Arnold Schoenberg. Entitled "The Book of the Hanging Gardens," the cycle is composed of 15 melodies for voice and piano written to poems by the contemporary German poet Stefan George.
