## Extended Service for Phones In Frontier Area Due Sunday

At 12:01 Sunday morning, June 1, all telephone service in the FRontier exchange will be converted to extended service, according to H. C. Vaupel, Associated Telephone Company, Ltd., manager in this area.

Vaupel pointed out that the FRontier extended service enables customers here to make an unlimited number of calls under their fixed monthly rate to all telephones having El Segundo, FRontier, Lomita, MEnlo, OSborne, TErminial and Torrance prefixes.

Customers have direct access to telephone numbers having MEnlo, OSborne and TErminial prefixes by dialing the first two letters of the prefix and then the listed telephone number. To call El Segundo, Lomita or Torrance numbers, which also are in the free calling area, the customer dials the operator who places the call for him.

Under extended service, all sent-paid calls into the Los Angeles extended area will be billed in terms of message units," Vaupel said, "thus effecting for customers a saving representing the difference between the message unit rate and the regular toll rate, as explained on page 5 of the telephone directory."

He also pointed out that the number of message units from the FRontier prefix area to most places in the Los Angeles extended area are listed on page 4 of the directory.

## Two New Faculty Members Appointed at El Camino

Two appointments to the El Camino college faculty have been announced by Forrest G. Murdock, president. The new instructors will begin teaching at the local school in September.

DeWayne B. Johnson, Los Angeles, will teach classes in journalism during the new school year. Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in journalism at the University of California in Berkeley. Ferguson has, in addition to an academic knowledge of his field, practical experience in the dramatic arts. He was, for a time, an actor at Columbia studios, and he has also done some work in radio dramas.

## Boat Owners Urged to Get Coast Guard Safety Check

Thousands of pleasure boatmen will have a safer, cheaper season in Southern California waters this summer with the United States Coast Guard "seal of safety" on their craft, Coast Guard officials said yesterday.

The annual Coast Guard Auxiliary Courtesy Motorboat Examination program, conducted by civilian auxiliaries for the boating public, offers boat owners who want it, a fine-toothed check of safety equipment and general vessel condition without a penalty for failing to pass.

In 1951 auxiliary courtesy examiners put examination stickers on the windshields of 29,000 boats in 38 states and in Puerto Rico and Hawaii. In the 11th Coast Guard District, which includes all of Southern California from Santa Barbara to San Diego, a great number of boatmen took this opportunity to practice safety first, before an oversight could make serious trouble.

Commodore Edwin F. Franke, civilian head of the Auxiliary in the 11th District, stressed that courtesy examinations are conducted only at the request of boat owners. The examination includes a check of all safety devices and practices required by Federal motorboat regulations. Auxiliary examiners also advise boat owners of Coast Guard-recommended items not required by law, but conducive to safety and peace of mind afloat.

Boat owners whose craft need some extra fitting-out to pass the courtesy examination are not reported, and no official action is taken, Commodore Franke said. Instead, owners are given advice and suggestions for correcting deficiencies, plus an offer of a prompt re-examination later if it is wanted.

"Boats passed by Auxiliary courtesy examiners receive a signed inspection check-off list and a serially numbered windshield decal," the commodore added. "Regular Coast Guard boarding parties know that vessels which display this sticker have had a thorough examination. In fact, these boats are safer than the law says they must be."

Boat owners who are interested in a voluntary courtesy examination and decal, should talk to any auxiliary member for details. Members fly the auxiliary's blue ensign when under way.

The courtesy examination program is one of the important services for boatmen offered by the Coast Guard Auxiliary, according to Commodore Franke.

He added: "Safety is the Auxiliary's mission." Auxiliary and non-member boatmen also can improve their personal sea-keeping abilities through the training program of the auxiliary during the off-season months.
