

Reporting this week to Rev. Paul Wenske, pastor of the First Lutheran Church, to serve a year's internship with the church was 23-year-old Donald Boyd, a third-year student at Capital University, Columbus, Ohio.

A student at the seminary in his hometown of Columbus, Boyd has completed two years of study at the university and will spend his third year here in the church, and then will return to the university to complete his work.

The young minister will begin his duties by taking over for Rev. Wenske during the coming six weeks while the pastor takes his annual vacation in the east. Rev. Wenske said yesterday that he will spend two weeks during his absence filling in at a Toledo, Ohio, church.

During his year in Torrance Boyd will assist Rev. Wenske with all church duties which are not reserved for ordained ministers, such as weddings. He will do some preaching, parish work, and other work with the church and church groups.

Boyd will stay at the church parsonage until the Wenskes return from their vacation, he said. He will then move to 1924 Andree Ave.

"We asked the university for an intern," Rev. Wenske said. "The rapid growth of the city and the corresponding growth of our church has created the need for assistance here," the pastor said.


