of themselves in the wilderness. The camping program provides swimming, horseback and burro riding, hiking, and after-dinner campfire programs. Handicraft work with nature's raw materials provide valuable experience.

Camping dates for the Torrance area are July 22 to 29. Mrs. Burnam said. Fee for the outing is \$22.50. Boys wanting to go should sign up now to assure themselves of a reservation. The camp folders explaining the program may be obtained by calling Torrance 1563.

Life, sickness and accident insurance is taken out on all boys who will attend the Torrance YMCA camp this summer. Information received from the Los Angeles YMCA indicates that the insurance will include a \$2500 life policy, \$1500 accident coverage, and \$350 sickness coverage.
