Fishing Lake Goal of State

Creation of a 10 to 17 acre fishing lake within an hour's drive of downtown Los Angeles is the goal of a new project authorized by the California Wildlife Conservation Board.

The three-man board allocated \$1000 at its last meeting for preliminary engineering surveys on Elizabeth Lake Canyon Creek, about 15 miles north of San Fernando. If the State Division of Water Resources survey proves the feasibility of such a project, the board will go ahead with plans for creation of a rock fill dam on the National Forest property.
