## Police Stress Need for Safety On City Streets

Adults as well as children should start back to school this month if the kids are to escape the traffic hazards they'll face traveling back and forth from classes, the California Highway Patrol said yesterday.

An important item for grown-ups to brush up on is the speed limit in school zones—15 miles an hour when children are going to and from school or playing in the schoolyard.

Another life-saving law for motorists to learn by heart is the one relating to the flashing red lights on school buses. Chief of Police John Stroth added.

When these lights are on, it means youngsters are getting on or off the bus and all other vehicles on the same roadway, whether they're going the same or opposite direction, must come to a complete stop and remain standing until the lights go out.

Chief Stroth said that in addition to strict observance of all traffic laws, drivers must be ready for the sometimes unpredictable actions of children.

"If you should kill or injure a little boy or girl, even though you were legally in the clear, your conscience would never let you forget it," he said.
