Comic Game Played



Attired in costumes of every conceivable description, the team members put on a real show. Some \$25 was raised for the fund.



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Either Sex Deer Hunting Planned

Five hundred California hunters will be given a chance to take part in an either-sex deer hunting season next November in the Barton's Flat area of Fresno and Tulare counties, under rulings just announced by the Fish and Game Commission.

To qualify, hunters must:

1. Appear in person at the Fresno office of the Department of Fish and Game between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., August 15 or 16;
2. Present a hunting license and deer tag;
3. Take their chances in a lottery-type drawing;
4. Appear in person at the Fresno office between August 20 and 23 to purchase a \$5 special permit if their application has been drawn.

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
