





Mr. John E. Henderson, widely known hearing aid authority, will be in Redondo Beach Friday and Saturday, September 12 and 13, to consult with those who are having difficulty hearing and understanding in church, groups and ordinary conversation.

Mr. Henderson, who specializes in fitting difficult cases, makes no charge for the consultation, held in cooperation with Beltona Hearing Aids, as a public service to deafened persons. The authority will test the hearing to determine the degree of hearing loss, and discover whether or not a hearing aid is advisable. If a hearing aid is

indicated, he recommends the use of a small, powerful aid such as the new Beltona Lyri. This instrument is very inconspicuous and, when fitted into Mr. Henderson's direction, hardly noticeable.

The consultation is available to all who have difficulty hearing or understanding, regardless of whether or not they are already using a hearing aid. FREE CLINIC to be held at 304 N.
