


MOOSE BOWLERS CAPTURE LEAGUE LEAD

TAILBACK HARRY FRALICH may be out for season

Fralich Snaps Leg; Injuries Hurt Hopes

The lights on the Torrance High football field were snapped on Friday night and the hopeful 1952 Tartar squad had a go at it for an hour and a half or so under the arcs, just to get in the swing of things for game time Friday night.

Injuries befell the gridders again during the last part of the week, as Harry Fralich, slated to fill a blocking back's shoes, took a flip and wound up with a "green-tree" fracture just below the knee.

Fralich, who favored a knee hurt several years ago, will be out for most of the season, if not all of it. He hobbled out to practice Friday night but played the scrimmage from the grandstands.

Also on the mend are John O'Hara, sporting a heavy cast for a fractured wrist, and Larry Roy, clearing up an infection which has kept him from full practice for several days.

Coach Cliff Graybehl put each string through 20 minutes of good play to give every lad a chance to grasp that "game-like" feeling.

Biggest worry still seems to be in filling the QB spot.

Viewers who took in Friday night's get-together agreed that the squad looked ragged, but boasted a much improved spirit, especially for so early in the season. The varsity performers have been practicing but ten or eleven days.

Up front, lack of a pair of cracker-jack guards is causing no little amount of worry. With Ted Marcoux, captain of the '52 squad, plugging the right side, there should be little trouble. But on the other, here comes the problem:

Defensive linemen stormed in on Wayne Michels and if he hadn't made a fast throw-away toss, he would have been clobbered for a sizable loss during Friday evening's practice.

Lots of Speed
Speed in the backfield appears to be quite plentiful, but a lack of weight could prove equally as dangerous. Harry Bayliss, TSS sprinter, has as much get-up-and-go as any man on the squad, but it's mighty easy to shove him around when once he's pegged.

Bob Brow, Bee sprinter during recent track festivities, has put many an inch, but nary a pound, on his frame.

Stalwart of the backfield quartet will be Berle Jones, rugged fullback candidate. Jones, the "old man" of the team, is a veteran of several campaigns and can be counted on to be as treacherous as a wild cat in a canary cage.

"Fair to good" is the forecast for hunters who will open the Sierra and northwestern deer season next Saturday, according to area reports from more than 40 State Department of Fish and Game wardens.

Shooting hours are from a half-hour before sunrise to a half-hour after sunset and limits are two bucks in the northwestern area and one buck in the Sierra zone.

Wardens' pre-season prediction reports range from "top notch" prospects in Kern County to "poor" in Lassen-Modoc. Other counties size up like this:

Amador—good; Butte—little posted land; Calaveras—lots of forked horns above 6000 feet; El Dorado—poor to fair; Fresno—normal, best in National Forest near Kings River; Humboldt—generally good; East Imperial—deer fat, but few; Eastern Tu-lare—try late in season; Kern—many bucks. Best in Greek horn mountains.


LUCE RIDES CYCLE TO CARRELL WIN
