

Bids Received for Two Huge Reservoirs

Contracts totaling nearly \$278,000 for a water well and miscellaneous supplies for the modernization of the city's water system were awarded to several bidders by the City Council Tuesday evening.

Sitting in an adjourned session of their meeting of the previous week, members of the council received bids for the 10,000,000-gallon reservoir and the 1,000,000-gallon reservoir, then awarded the bids submitted previously on the recommendation of the engineers overseeing the expansion.

Apparent low bidder for the 1,000,000-gallon reservoir to be located at McMaster Park in North Torrance was the Contracting Engineering Co. with a bid of \$65,800. The Chicago Bridge and Iron Co. submitted an alternate bid of \$39,025. Their bid was for a steel tank similar to the one now located be- side the high tank on Elm Ave. in Torrance Gardens. Specifications were for a steel and concrete tank.

Chadwick and Buchanan had bid of \$422,268. The bids were referred to the engineers for study and recommendation to the council next week.
