

# 'Round the Riviera



## Ballot Issues Get Endorsement Of EC Students

Resolutions 2 and 24 to appear on the Nov. 4 ballot received unanimous endorsement by the Student Council of El Camino College this week, it was revealed yesterday.

Lester Mitchell, student commissioner of public relations, said that members of the council felt they would like to go on record as supporting both propositions which can have considerable effect on the future of California public schools.

Proposition 2 increases the proportion of state aid which will go to various school districts for education and Proposition

24 concerns the financing of school buildings.

A faculty committee has been formed to work on behalf of the propositions. Members include: College President Forrest Murdock, publicity chairman; Richard Haly, chairman; Lee Mitchell, student associate member; Willis Weber, speakers bureau chairman; and Tom Wilson, material distribution chairman.
