### Overcoming Sin Told In Sunday Bible Lesson

Both cures require the same method and are inseparable in Truth." "Your true course is to destroy the foe, and leave the field to God. "We of the DAV feel that this slogan sums up the reasons and aims of our campaign in words that will inspire every citizen," said Commander Carrier.

"The forget-me-not has been the official blue flower of remembrance of the DAV since it was founded 30 years ago. The disabled have never forgotten the disabled. The DAV has been dedicated to helping them."

"To wear one of these flowers on Forget-Me-Not Day is an indication that the citizen has not forgotten the men and women who came back with wartime handicaps and injuries. It is to express gratitude in a concrete way."

Commander Carrier said that all funds raised during the campaign would be used to aid disabled veterans in this area. He pointed out that the local chapter also helps the wartime handicapped to obtain adequate compensation and pension as well as hospitalization and employment.
