

## Red Feather Drive To Open Here Monday

Monday will be the day of the big push in Torrance for scores of Community Chest campaign volunteers.

On Monday, a throng of men and women representing the business and residential units will begin door to door canvassing on behalf of the Chest, seeking to raise their share of Torrance's goal.

"They hope to have this job finished by nightfall. City Chairman Don Armstrong said.

This year Torrance's Red Feather workers are seeking to raise \$12,864—largest quota in the city's history.

### Group Organized

Mrs. Edward L. Schwartz, chairman of the residential unit, reported that her group of workers was completely organized and ready to go.

Last year Torrance was the first city in the Los Angeles Chest area to finish its residential campaign.

"We did the campaign in one day last year, and we're sure that we can do it again this year in the same time," she said.

"All of our workers are sure that it can be done in a day, and that enthusiasm is what counts," Mrs. Schwartz continued.

Monday morning the residential workers will gather at the Torrance YWCA for their kick-off meeting. The YW will be used as Chest campaign headquarters for the day.

### Firm Praised

High praise of Community Chest leaders went this week to one of Torrance's major industries, the American Radiator

and Standard Sanitary Corp., which came through with a total of 206 of its 278 employees contributing a total of \$1189.

"This means that 96 per cent of our personnel here contributed to the Red Feather campaign this year," said Plant Manager Henry W. Creeger. Average contribution amounted to \$4.40, Creeger reported.






