### Little League Boosters to Meet At YMCA Building This Evening

Regular meeting of the Little League baseball association of Torrance will be held at the YMCA building this evening beginning at 7:30, it was announced yesterday by Doug Moir, chairman of the group.

Further reports on the procurement of a playing field will be made, he announced. Also on the agenda is a report on the prices and availability of player equipment.

"All parents of boys interested in playing in the league are welcome at these meetings," Moir emphasized.

Committees working on various aspects of the formation of a Little League in Torrance have been announced by Moir. Making up the field procurement committee are D. M. Hawkins, Lyle Hanon and J. L. Boucher. The finance committee includes J. A. Gates, Dr. Alden Smith and Dr. Howard Wood. The equipment committee in-

was available for a field at the present time.

A report on the cost of providing minimum lighting for the field would include at least \$450 for poles, \$2500 for wiring and labor, and \$792 for reflectors. The total would be approximately \$3742.

Attempts to secure land for a diamond site from the Santa Fe Land Development or from CCMO were discussed.

Approximate cost of outfitting a 15-man team was set at \$708 and for an 18-man team at \$901.

Operation of an eight-team league would cost about \$1420 if the teams were limited to 15 boys and about \$1800 if the teams carried 18 players, it was reported at the meeting.
