Tartars, Sentinels Meet In Final Game

It's Homecoming for Torrance High School tomorrow on the Tartar field, and Inglewood's Sentinels will furnish the opposition for the final game of 1952.

At the same time, it's hall and farewell for 17 seniors who will be playing their final football game under the maroon and grey pennant.

A win would give Torrance a tie for second place.

Coach Cliff Graybell said his attack depends on how halfback Harry Bayliss goes. Bayliss has been limping on a game leg ever since he was injured in the Redondo game. He no longer pulled out of that one than he re-injured the same gam in the Beverly Hills fray.

Provides Spark

Bayliss provides the spark while he's in there, and as he goes, so goes, probably, the Tartar varsity. Bayliss' speed and Beryl Jones' power from the full back spot provide the heart of the Torrance attack, with Jim Farrar's flinging contributing deception to the offense.

Tuesday morning the Tartars staged a full-fledged game scrimmage, with the first team punching over for two scores, one on an interception and the second set up by the defense.

Graybell said the team is high for Inglewood. They are still smarting from the 7-6 loss to Beverly Hills last week, a contest they should have won by a comfortable margin.

Three Speedy Backs

Heart of the Sentinel offense is contained in three speedy backs, one of whom may be injured, since he saw no action in the 46-0 romp over Leuzinger. That player is Fullback Tiberio, who called three times against Redondo as Inglewood knocked off the beach boys 27-6. Southpaw passer Arrellaga is expected to give the defensive unit a little trouble, as is a gentleman named Rattery, who is reputed to possess much speed, although of diminutive stature.

Lost One Game

In and out of league play, the Sentinels have lost only one game, to Santa Monica, by three touchdowns.

Ten of the eleven starters tomorrow will be graduating seniors. The only exception is Don Kasten, junior quarterback.

Murder Vikes, 55-14 Warriors Favored To Bop Corsairs

El Camino's fighting gridder should take Saturday night's game in their stride as they build up to the climatic thriller with Valley JC for the loop title on the home field next week.

But Coach Norm Verry is well aware that overconfidence and not curiosity is what kills the cat and has been putting the Warriors through stiff paces.

The locals will jaunt to Santa Monica, where they will clash with the Corsairs, who have won two and lost as many in Metro loop play.

There is little doubt that the Corsairs shook a mite as they learned that El Camino blasted the Long Beach Vikes 55-14 last week-end under the arcs at Lon Beach's Memorial Stadium.

John Bandwagon

Perhaps the locals spent all day listening to the basketball-like scores tallied by the Trojans and Bruins, and decided that they too would make with a landslide—whatever it was, it was too much for the poor Vikes.

Boasting a big injury list, Long Beach was forced to play some irregulars on the starting squad and kept that quartet in the game virtually the entire fray.

Besides whooping up a lopsided score, the Warriors looked sharp on the field—playing one of their nicest games of the year. Blocking was at a high as linemen and backs pulled out to pave the way for the ball carriers.

Exceptional was a block tossed by Halfback Dick Hill, which enabled Ken Swearingen to take a reverse from QB Bill Crawford and shimmy 49 yards for the initial counter. Hill cracked into a Vike safely man as the latter moved in to capture Ken on the 5-yard mark.

Form Interference

Other key blocks counted for the large number of tallies; particularly noticeable was the forming of an interference on each of the four interceptions made by the Caminoans.

Scoring once in the initial quarter, twice in the second, three times in the third, the locals held off in the final stanza, and third and fourth stringers pushed across only a pair of pointers.

Verry swept the bench in the second half, baffling sports scribes and announcers, who found some gridder on the field who weren't even listed on the roster.

Crawford again turned in a masterful job at the signal-calling position, tossing and handing off at the opportune moments. Indication that the Warriors mixed it up is evidenced by the fact that eight TD's were tallied by eight ball handlers.


