IDECO OFFICIALS SAY FEDERAL SPENDING MUST BE LIMITED

"Torrance people will suffer a sharp increase in the burden of supporting the federal government, and loss of individual liberties, unless limits are placed on federal spending."
So said Donald M. Maher of the International Derrick and Equipment Co., after studying a survey of the economic research council of the National Assn. of Manufacturers.
"Torrance people will suffer a new burden in addition to the fourth their income, and \$1,500-

600 share of the federal debt at present, the survey detailed."
More and More
In disclosing these figures of the NAM, Maher said, "It is distressingly clear that as the federal government takes more and more of our locally created income and imposes higher and higher taxes and debts, several tragic things are happening."
"Individually we lose our financial strength to plan our own future and that of our families."
"We also lose personal liberties and freedom, as the fed-

eral government imposes registration in the guise of necessity of controlling the very inflation it causes by wasteful spending and taxing."
"Local government, too, suffers loss of initiative, since the NAM economic report shows that nearly 80 per cent of locally created revenues are absorbed by the federal government, leaving less and less for such essential local services as education, police, and fire protection."
Fuel For Fires
"Unless drastic action is taken

against further threats of inflation by the present administration of the federal government, we shall be throwing gasoline on the fires."
"The current NAM report urges that a \$265 billion firm ceiling be placed on the federal public debt, a cut of \$10 billion from the present \$275 billion legal limit."
"When a \$265 billion debt limit is established, our federal government can then proceed with

a sound debt management program, and then plan a stricter limitation of federal spending itself."
"We should all urge our representatives in Congress to set a firm limit on public debt, and to curtail expenditures not strictly in the public interest."
