munity bank's statement. As of Dec. 31, 1952, total capital advanced to \$314,259.66 compared to \$271,358.71 at the same date in 1951. Likewise deposits grew from \$5,199,306.45 in December 1951, to \$6,675,903.51 as of Dec. 31, 1952. Total resources as

shown by the year-end statement reached an all-time figure of \$6,990,163.17, according to President Post.






