Drilling Rigs Made Here Probe For Black Gold in Trinidad

A number of large Diesel-powered drilling rigs made at the Torrance plant of the National Supply Co. are engaged in deep exploratory drilling in search of oil on the island of Trinidad, West Indies.

The bulk of the equipment was made and shipped from the local plant on March 6, 1952.

The rig spudded-in in Trinidad on its first well on July 23. At last reports, it was drilling at a depth of 4000 feet.

The equipment was delivered by ship, then transported overland to the drilling sites. Much of the labor was supplied by native personnel, who set up and operate the rigs.

In use by Apex Oilfields, Ltd. is an Ideal Type 130 drilling rig manufactured at the Torrance plant. The firm also uses a Type 160, also made here, with a modified three-section drive group powered by three Superior Type PTD5G-8 Dual Fuel Supercharged engines.

For hoisting casing the rig is equipped with a hoisting block rated at 300 tons—the Type 648-TU Crown Block, also manufactured locally, according to a spokesman here.

Chinchilla Class To Be Offered

In response to the requests of chinchilla raisers in the community, a new course in chinchilla husbandry will be offered at El Camino College during the spring semester, Dr. William H. Harless, director of instruction, said today.

"Interested persons may register in the college and enroll in the course during the regular registration period which begins Feb. 2."

Harless advised anyone interested in taking any courses at El Camino College during the spring semester to contact the college immediately. The registration and enrollment period will be limited to two weeks, he said.

Youth Leaders Told to Stay on An Even Keel with Teen-Agers

Having troubles with your teen-ager? If so, keep an even keel and don't let him know you're nervous and anxious, if it kills you.

This was the advice of John Milner, associate professor of social work, University of Southern California, who last week addressed youth leaders from

by making him feel lonely and rejected.

Most of all, Milner said, the adolescent needs a "constant and consistent relationship with someone who will accept him as he is, who will know that he is not all good nor all bad.

"Don't expect him to act his age," Milner said. "Most adolescent tensions result from too much stress on actual age.

"Try to remember that he is fighting the most difficult battle of his life so far, to make himself acceptable to his age group, to society as a whole, and most of all, to himself.

"Don't desert him in mid-stream. No matter how tough the job may be, make him feel you're with him and for him," Milner said.
