Moon Goes Cold As Sentinels Tounce Tartars

The Inglewood Sentinels, led by Forward Gabe Arillaga, had a relatively easy time of it taking the Tartars in tow here Friday night. They beat the locals 55-42 to make the season a horse and a horse for the two teams.

Tartar Guard Bob Moon, who has been leading the team in scoring, had an off night and could account for only eight points—all of them free throws.

Forward Jerry Farrar led the local scoring with 13 points. Arillaga made 24 for the Sents. The Tartars pulled within four points of the Sents early in the third quarter, but the accurate shooting of the visitors was too much for the locals.

In the preliminary game, the Torrance Bees pulled one out of the hat by dropping the Sentinels 65-51 in a thriller.

A free throw and two fast goals in the last 20 seconds of the game broke up a tie situation. The Bees will play in the Santa Monica lightweight tournament next week-end, beginning Friday noon. Pairings have not been released yet, according to Coach Don Porter.

Keeping a line on the league-leading teams in the city's Class B League is about as simple as driving a nail with a banana.


Right now, four teams are leading the league, with a 4-3 record. Trailing the leaders are two teams, each with a belief-it-or-not 2½-4½ score.

The margin of victory was rolled up the fourth quarter as Weiss and Center Harlan Geach took over the backboards and kept the ball in Redondo's possession most of the final frame. Geach, who has been one of the team's high scorers this season, tallied 13 points against the Vikes.

In the preliminary game, the Redondo Bees beat the Santa Monica five 37-34.

In the other league game, Leuzinger missed a last second field goal to lose a 48-47 thriller to Beverly Hills. The Beverly Hills Bees won 50-24.

Torrance will wind up league play here Friday night, Feb. 27, when Leuzinger and the locals battle it out for last place. The Tartars have beaten Inglewood and Santa Monica this year; Leuzinger has beaten Torrance and Inglewood.
