



The class saw the film "Angry Boy" at the last meeting, and engaged in discussion on special problems of child guidance.

Pension Bills Before State To Be Discussed

Twenty-two pension bills, introduced into the California Legislature last month by the Old Folks Lobby will be discussed in detail at a special meeting of elderly citizens of this community and their friends, to be held at the Moose Hall, 1744 Carson St., tomorrow at 3 p.m.

Special discussion will center around the following bills because of their importance to the present welfare of California's needy senior-citizens:

1. Bill to reduce the period of waiting from 60 to 30 days for approval of an original application for old-age security.
 2. Bill to ease the real property requirements of present old-age pensioners.
 3. Bill to make it easier for a pensioner to move from one county to another.
 4. Bill to hike old-age assistance from the present maximum of \$80 to a maximum of \$100.
- In addition, plans for the establishment of a national old-age pension of \$100 a month, to be paid by the Federal Government, will be reviewed by qualified speakers. Meeting is open to the public. There is no admission charge.

Instructor Mrs. Irene Worth, formerly of Syracuse University of New York, said tonight's lecture would be entitled, "Every Family Has Problems."
