Christian Church Groundbreaking Set

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the new edifice of the First Christian Church will be observed at Eldorado and Maple Ave. Sunday following church services, it was announced yesterday by Rev. C. J. England, pastor of the church.



Following the ceremony, those at the groundbreaking will hold a family picnic dinner on the grounds. Hot coffee will be provided, Rev. England said.


WEATHER DATA


