THS Newspaper Wins Redlands U. Journalism Prize

A certificate of merit was awarded to the Torrance High School newspaper, the TNT, at Journalism Day, held at the University of Redlands Monday, according to Myron Roberts, faculty advisor for the paper.

200 high schools were entered in the competition, Roberts said, and prizes were awarded only to the top ten per cent. Newspapers were judged on the basis of coverage, use of features, and makeup.

Students from Torrance who attended the Journalism Day were Dave Parton, Sandy Sanders, Jerry Westmoreland, Thelma Smith and Gene Davis. The students participated in lectures, discussion groups, and were taken on a tour of the college journalism plant.

Last year, TNT took first place at an El Camino JC Journalism festival. The TNT editor this semester is Pam Dickey.
