### Board Calls Two Harbor Teachers To Loyalty Quiz

Two teachers from the Harbor district have been summoned to testify in closed hearing before the Los Angeles Board of Education Wednesday under provisions of the recently passed Dilworth loyalty law. Under the Dilworth Act, which bans Communists from the teaching profession, teachers must answer questions concerning their loyalty or face possible dismissal by the Board. The act went into effect Sept. 9, 90 days to swear loyalty to the nation under the law in order to prevent dismissal. The Harbor District teachers are Mrs. Ann R. Shugerman, Corner, of 1411 W. 25th St., Harbor City, a teacher at Hall-dale Ave. School, and Helen Elizabeth Hughes, 3869 Second Ave., a teacher at the 259th Pl. School. ### Funds Received For More Paving Along Crenshaw

A \$15,000 allocation from the county for paving of Crenshaw Blvd. from Pacific Coast Hwy. to Rolling Hills Rd. was received by the city this week, according to City Manager George Stevens. The funds come from the Highways-Through-Cities funds, according to Supervisor Charles Right-of-way, curbs, and gutters have already been constructed, Stevens said. Bids for the paving of the stretch through a new home tract will be called early next month. Work is now nearing completion on the strip of Crenshaw from Sepulveda to Lomita Blvd., and the balance between Palms Verdes Dr. North to Lomita will be completed under the \$15,000 grant.
