### Tax Forms for Employers Out

Robert C. Kirkwood, chairman of the Franchise Tax Board, has announced that Information Return forms have been mailed to all employers who filed last year or who have recently requested Forms 599 and 596.

"If you employed anyone during 1953 and paid \$2,000 or more to a single person, or \$3,500 or more to a married person, you are liable to file a Form 599 for each individual," Kirkwood explained.

Forms and any information concerning them may be obtained from the Franchise Tax Board, Sacramento, or from the local office of the Board at 206 State Building, First and Broadway, Los Angeles.


### Lecturer's Topic Scientific Prayer
