Interest in Youth Marks Burk Campaign

Francis W. Burk, of 5104 Zenon Rd., is following a family tradition by exhibiting an interest in civic affairs.

His interest in local government was no doubt instilled at an early age by his mother, Mrs. Rose Burk, who organized the first youth recreation center in Santa Monica many years ago.

Here Since 1948 Burk, who lives in his Seaside Heights residence with his wife, Sue, and children Clifford 18, Donna 6, and William Earl, who will be four this summer, has been a Torrance resident since his return from service with the United States Paratroops in 1948.

Prior to the war, Burk served as a service and flight instructor for Douglas Aircraft Co. Exhibiting an interest in youth activities even then, he opened one of the first boys' clubs in Hollywood in 1940.
