

Record Number of THS Seniors Qualified for College---Harter

The Torrance High School senior class has the largest number of students who are qualified to enter college in the school's history this year, Vice Principal Dale Harter told the Torrance Educational Advisory Committee Monday.

Of 230 students in the class, 50 per cent have grade averages of B minus or better, Harter said, and thus qualify to enter college.

A group of 90 students took college aptitude tests for entrance to El Camino Junior College Monday morning.

In a talk on "College Counseling," Harter told the members of the TEAC that the counseling program begins when the student is in the eighth grade and continues through high school and even beyond.

The high school began a visitation program this year in which faculty members and seniors visited former Tartars who have gone on to college and asked them what they missed most while in high school.

Seven colleges were visited this year by teachers and students and a mutual exchange of knowledge and ideas resulted.

Next year a panel of college students will return to the high school to talk to juniors and seniors, Harter said.

Begins in 8th Grade
In his explanation of the counseling program, the Vice Principal told the TEAC members that faculty representatives begin by visiting eighth grade students to

discuss what will be required of them in high school to qualify for college.

In the ninth grade, a teacher-counselor is responsible for each student and helps him evaluate his progress each spring, near the end of the term.

The 12th grade senior problems course has a special unit wherein the "College or Work?" problem is discussed with seniors, and requirements are checked.
