

Kenny Drive Breaks Record Set Last Year

Mrs. Grace Osborne, volunteer Torrance city chairman for the recent Sister Kenny Polio Fund drive, announced yesterday that contributions from Torrance citizens totaled \$1087.64, well above last year's record.

Success of the campaign, she stated, was entirely due to the volunteers who rallied around her to help with the drive as well as everyone's willingness to support the need for polio funds when asked for their help.

Because of the success of the recent drive, she stated, the polio foundation is going ahead with plans to enlarge the hospital facilities in El Monte by establishing the Sister Kenny Memorial Annex. This will double the present 65-bed capacity so that more people will be assured the Kenny treatment for polio.

The only hospital in the west to specialize in the complete Kenny method for the treatment of the dread crippler, it is open to all, regardless of race, religion, color, residence, age or ability to pay.

Of the overall \$425,000 Kenny goal for this year \$337,372.74 has been received.

Albert H. Bartlett has already served several years beyond the retirement limit for the State Retirement System and deserves to spend his remaining years in at least a small measure of security and comfort the same as any other faithful employee whether Public or Industrial.
