Edison Plant Gets New Generators

The first of two 125,000 kilowatt generating units at Southern California Edison Company's \$40,000,000 Etiwanda steam station in San Bernardino County has been placed in full operation, according to L. B. Jenkins, Edison district manager. Operation of the second unit is planned for about Oct. 1. Total capacity of the station will be 250,000 kilowatts.

Designed and constructed by Stone and Webster Engineering Corporation in collaboration with the Edison engineers, the Etiwanda

steam station will be capable of producing approximately 1,800,000 kilowatt hours of electricity annually when fully operative. Its capacity will be nearly as great as that of the company's present Redondo steam station, and almost one half that of Edison's famous Big Creek hydroelectric development in the High Sierra, Jenkins said.
