A DRIVER IN AN AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENT

Lawyers know that accidents may leave victims and bystanders upset and confused. So wise people form a plan of conduct in advance. Then, in an emergency, they do the right thing almost without thinking. They have thought through the main steps already.

Here are some things for a driver to do or not to do:

- Stop!
- Assist the injured.
- Get license numbers.
- Identify the other driver.
- Identify yourself to him.
- Contact witnesses.
- Make written notes.
- Report the accident to the police or sheriff.
- Notify your insurance carrier.
- See a doctor if necessary.
- Stop when you can without blocking traffic. Never drive away from an accident without giving the other party your name. To do so is a crime. See if anyone is hurt. If so, and if the injury is serious, call a doctor or an ambulance—whichever is quicker. Make the hurt person comfortable. But do not move him in any way that could add to his injury.

This may bear repetition: Get the other driver's name, address, license number. Give him yours. Give these facts to any of the injured. Show your driver's license to the injured and the other driver upon request.

If the accident takes place at night, see that flares or other signals are placed to warn oncoming traffic. Get as many witnesses' names and addresses as you can and their story of what took place.



WRITE IT DOWN on the spot. Take written notes and be specific. Step off distances. Note your speed if you know it. Note if the road was wet, and if the traffic light was working. Diagram the positions of the cars. If the accident is serious, stay until the police come and give them your help. If anyone is hurt, you must report the accident.

Examiners for Drivers' Licenses Slate Vacation

Examiners for the State Department of Motor Vehicles will take a month off during August and September, it was announced here yesterday by Police Chief J. H. Stroth.

The Torrance visits of the drivers' license examiners normally scheduled for the first, third, and fifth Mondays of each month will be suspended

from Aug. 17 until Sept. 21, Stroth said.

After the Aug. 3 visit, the examiners will not be here until Sept. 21.

Files of incomplete applications filed in Torrance will be maintained at the Culver City office at 11854 W. Washington Blvd., Stroth said.

The Hawthorne and San Pedro offices will be closed during the same period. Persons wanting drivers' license renewals or to make application for new licenses during that time will have to visit offices in Compton, Culver City, or Los Angeles.
