New Baby? DIAPER DUTY EASY WHEN DONE DAILY THIS SIMPLE WAY
Have you a baby in your home? What a joy . . . and what a problem, too! Your particular problem is those diapers. There they are, and they've got to be done, because your chief aim is the baby's comfort. To make it easier for you, and to get the best results, here are a few rules to follow.

Scheduling is a must in caring for baby, and the diaper duty will fit right in if you plan it as a daily chore. When your young pride and joy has an accident, dunk soiled diapers immediately into the toilet bowl, holding them by one corner. Then put them into a special soaking solution in a two-gallon enamel pail with a cover. The solution is made with one gallon of cold water and two tablespoons of borax.

After wringing out the soaking solution, wash the diapers in HOT water — the hotter the better. Plentiful suds, a little of head bluing, and a good water conditioner, if necessary, also are important in the washing step. Putting the detergent base and head bluing right in the washing water is much better than the old-fashioned way of putting it in the rinse water. There's no chance of over-bluing and every bit of the soap and detergent is rinsed away.

You'll find your washing machine is your best friend for laundering baby's things. You need run the machine only five minutes if these instructions are followed. After rinsing, shake diapers well and dry, then smooth and fold. Never iron. The diapers will be softer and more comfortable for baby if left unironed — so wh' work when you don't have to!
