

Lennox Sheriff in Drive For Auxiliary Deputies

A concerted drive to recruit an auxiliary deputy organization is now in progress in the Lennox Sheriff's Station, 4331 Lennox Blvd., Inglewood.

This organization, to be composed of interested citizens, will function in the event of any major disaster affecting the area now under the jurisdiction of the Lennox Station.

Citizens desiring to join will

be required to uniform and equip themselves at a total cost not to exceed \$20. Thorough training in disaster law and techniques will be afforded each recruit as well as an opportunity to get together with his neighbors in serving the home community.

Interested persons are urged to contact Deputy W. J. Kennard at ORchard 17551 or OREGON 9-3801, Station 70, for full particulars of the program.

The protection of the community in time of emergency or disaster is the business of every good citizen therein, stated Kennard. Volunteering after disaster strikes does little good as the average volunteer is untrained, and therefore of little use.

Further, screening of volunteers to prevent potential criminals from easy access to looting requires precious time. When and if a disaster strikes this area it is estimated that an auxiliary unit of 800 men, at minimum, will be needed for proper policing, Kennard said.
