New City Recreation Director Takes Over

Taking over as director of the Torrance Recreation Department this week was 37-year-old Harry Van Bellehem, of 2071 W. 162nd St., who succeeds Frank Carpenter in the job.

Van Bellehem, who has been acting district manager for the eastern section of the Los Angeles County Parks and Recreation Department for the past six years was appointed by the City Council here last June. Van Bellehem was the top man in the Civil Service examination held for the job earlier.

Ocean Avenue School to Open

Plans to open the Ocean Ave. Elementary School in temporary bungalows next year were discussed by the Board of Education here this week.

At its regular meeting here Tuesday, the board authorized Superintendent of Schools J. H. Hull to proceed with the school architect on a plot plan for the site and to negotiate with the Inglewood School District for some bungalows which that system has declared surplus.

Dr. Hull told the board that his staff had determined that a six-classroom school could be opened on the South Torrance site for less than \$5000.

The property, already owned by the school district, lies just west of Hawthorne Ave. and south of 230th St. on a proposed extension of Lomita Blvd.

Opening of the new school will probably not come before early 1954, Dr. Hull said.

Bungalows now in use at the Torrance Elementary School will not be released until the Howard A. Wood School is completed—probably next February.

Those temporary buildings, along with any obtained from other districts, would form the new school.

"And by the time we can get the permanent school built at Ocean Ave., there will be enough students there to fill it and the temporary bungalows," Hull told the board.

Plans to open the Ocean Ave. School were brought up after it was indicated that double sessions would probably be necessary, at least in the seventh grade, at Seaside by mid-year.
