2475 Enrolled in 'Biggest Ever' Summer School Here

Torrance's "biggest ever" summer school program closed Friday after a total of 2475 elementary, high school, and adult students attended the six-week session.

Walter Rehwoid, director of instruction for the Torrance Unified School District, said Friday that Torrance had had one of the largest summer school sessions in the state, and that it was the result of a program based on the idea of special help in any area needed by the student.

Attending the 1953 summer session classes were 1570 elementary students and 906 high school and adult students, Rehwoid said. This was the first year that high school courses were offered for credit here during the summer and the popularity of the classes will probably mean that they will be continued in the future, according to the school official.

Son Born To Olympic Star

Louis Zamperini, Torrance High School, USC and Olympic Games track star, became the father of a 9½ pound future miler Monday evening at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Los Angeles.
