Leong, brought here on a scholarship by the Hawthorne Rotary Club, was a young high school student in his native land.

Attends American School
Following the war he attended Methodist High School there and he now speaks English fluently. Young Leong told the Optimists how his country was impoverished and dazed by five years of warfare, and how the

people were dominated by a desire for peace. After the Japanese occupation, the country's leaders declared Indonesia a free nation, and followed through with a five-year battle to keep the Dutch from reoccupying the government.
Nation Freed
In December of 1949, Leong said, the UN gave a cease-fire order and subsequent talks at The Hague in Holland resulted in transferring sovereignty to the Indonesian government. In 1950 Indonesia became the 60th member of the United Nations.
