El Camino Sets Date For Night Class Signups

Early registration for students who plan to attend El Camino College in the evening will begin August 24th according to Merl F. Sloan, director of student personnel. Increased enrollment has necessitated this attempt to relieve the long registration lines which form in September, according to the college official. The early registration is scheduled for August 24th through September 3rd from 5:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. For those students who wish to enroll for the first time in English, Algebra or Chemistry, the college is offering placement examinations Saturday, August 22 at 10:30 a.m. and August 23rd at 7 p.m. A fall schedule of classes is now available, Sloan said, for those students who wish to plan their programs early. Counselors are available at the college to assist students with their planning. Registration for day students will begin September 14th.
