

New Greyhound Bus to Visit Here Tuesday

Greyhound's revolutionary new bus, "The Highway Traveler," will be on display for public inspection here next Tuesday between 10 and 11 a. m. at the Torrance Greyhound depot next to Daniels Cafe on Cabrillo, it was announced yesterday.

Making the announcement was Glen G. Magnuson, general traffic and sales manager of Pacific Greyhound Lines.

According to Magnuson, the new "Highway Traveler" is one of the greatest developments in bus transportation history. Air suspension, power steering, and large picture windows are sensational new comfort and safety features incorporated in the new bus.

The air suspension system completely eliminates metal leaf springs, and compressed air, held captive in eight flexible air bellows, two to each wheel, silently and efficiently absorbs all types of road shock.

"Passengers traveling on this new bus will enjoy a new era of white letters or read without vibration due to the smooth ride as the result of the operation of the air suspension system," Magnuson said.

Five hundred of the new coaches are being delivered nationally to Greyhound by General Motors, and 175 of them will operate in Pacific Greyhound territory, according to Magnuson.
