


Get Up to Date Or New Law Will Seal Your Fate

"Are you up to date?" The California Highway Patrol asks this question of the state's six million motorists as the day approaches when some

133 Vehicle Code changes will become law. "For instance, do you know that after Sept. 9 the driver of any vehicle following another vehicle within 200 feet during hours that lights are required must use low beam headlights?"

The reason for this, the Patrol says, is that night glare from bright headlights has often been a factor in highway collisions. "This revision, properly observed, should be a great help in reducing accidents and annoyance caused by reflected glare from the rear," comments B. E. Caldwell, California Highway Patrol Commissioner, in discussing this change. "All motor vehicles registered after January 1, 1954, shall be equipped with a mirror so located as to reflect to the driver a view of the highway at least 200 feet to the rear, by terms of another amendment. An additional change of general interest is the provision that at least that portion of the registration card which shows the name and address of the registered owner and the license number of the vehicle shall be plainly visible and legible from outside the vehicle."
