

Pastor Begins Sermon Series

"The Living Bible" will be the topic of Pastor John Taylor's sermons at the 9 and 11 a.m. worship services at the First Methodist Church this morning, the first of a series of Sunday sermons on "The Living Bible."

The series will discuss six Old Testament characters followed by six New Testament books. The purpose of the series is to increase the understanding of the Bible and to show how its message applies to present problems, the Rev. Taylor said.

"We must yearn," Rev. Taylor said, "to use the Bible as a guide to religious experience and not as a fetish to be magically manipulated."

Job Seekers Lessened as Summer Ends

The number of summer unemployed continued to drop this month with an announcement from Winona Ellis, manager of the local State Department of Employment, that 446 persons are currently seeking work through her office.

This is a drop of 84 from the August figure of 530 unemployed, which dropped from the July high of 583 unemployed. Included in the September figure are 233 women and 213

men. Thirty-six per cent of the men are veterans. The highest number of unemployed fall into the "Labor" category, with 95 laborers, including all kinds of plant, factory and construction workers, seeking jobs.

There are 83 "skilled" workers seeking work and 76 "Clerical" workers. More "Semi-Skilled" workers have obtained employment in September than in any other classification, with the total number showing a drop from 107 in August to 74 this month.
