You can do anything you want to with the extra hour that will result when Daylight Savings time comes to an end at 2 a.m. Sunday—well, almost anything.

California tavern owners will gleefully turn the hands of their clocks back to 1 a.m. when the usual 2 a.m. closing time comes around Sunday and thus will comply with the procedure for returning to Standard Time and will also garner an extra 60 minutes of gravy.

That'll get them even for the hour they lost when Daylight Savings took effect on April 26. If you're taking a train within the state, you're OK—their schedules will change with the times; if you're taking a transcontinental jaunt, prepare to leave an hour earlier. Transcontinental trains stay on Standard Time, no matter what, and will arrive and depart an hour earlier.


(Continued from Page 1) dealers, are the three major prizes to be awarded. Inventory of the complete treasure is listed on page 25, this Herald issue.


