Singapore-Born Minister's Son to Show India Films

John Arkoiasamy, born in Singapore, whose father has been from the past 40 years a Protestant minister, will show color slides of India and display various crafts and arts of South India at the First Methodist Church this evening at 7:30 p.m., according to an announcement by Rev. John Taylor, pastor.

Highlights of the program including the showing of symbolic and mythological religious ceremonies, Agra and its famous Taj Mahal, Mahatma Gandhi's assassination, and Independence Day events. The speaker spent 14 years in Methodist schools overseas. He came to the United States for his college education which includes attendance at La Sierra College, George Pepperdine College, Los Angeles Trade Technical College, and Los Angeles City College. He majored in education and international relations.

The speaker's father is now retired and working among Tamil communities with American missionaries in Malaya. The program is the second in a series offered by the Methodist School of Missions, states Rev. Taylor.

Chace Answers Council Protest Of City Slicing

In answer to a protest letter from the Torrance City Council over the redistricting of Torrance into two supervisorial districts, County Supervisor Burton Chace sent a letter to the Council this week stating that he thought that the redistricting would be advantageous to the city by giving it two voices on the Board of Supervisors rather than one.

The redistricting puts parts of Torrance into Supervisor Kenneth Hahn's district and a d d s

his voice to that of Chace on the Board.

Torrance councilmen objected to the change because: 1) it splits up the city, and 2) the city was not notified of the plan before the slicing took place—a matter of political courtesy, councilmen said.

Chace assured the Council, in his letter that he would continue to vote as if the entire city were within his boundaries.

Dear Friends:

I have received Mr. Hall's letter of September 28th, written at the direction of the City Council of Torrance, to express its displeasure over the recent redistricting.

I sincerely believe that after due consideration, the City Council will feel that it is an advantage to have two Super-

visors looking after their best interests. The City of Long Beach has for many years been represented by two members of the Board of Supervisors; that City has always felt this advantageous, and has wanted to maintain the status quo.

It is with deep personal regret, however, that I relinquish my representation of any part of Torrance. As you know, formerly the Supervisorial Districts were so out of balance in population and area served, that redistricting was a necessity. The result was as nearly satisfactory as could be expected in such a gargantuan task. May I assure you that although a
