



Sacramento Report



1953 Veteran Legislation During the 1953 session of the California Legislature, several bills directly pertaining to veterans were enacted. These were known as Assembly bills and Senate bills until passed by both houses of the Legislature and signed by the Governor, after which they became known as "Chapters," and referred to by the public as laws or statutes.

Definition of Veteran Chapter 1234 expands the definition of veteran in provisions for benefits of veterans of World War I to exclude persons with less than 90 days active service unless discharged for service connected disability within 90 days.

Farm and Home Loans Chapter 355 amends the Military and Veteran Code by increasing the permitted value of a farm from \$15,000 to \$15,500 and a home from \$11,000 to \$12,500 in determining the amount of a loan.

Optometric License Chapter 1476 requires the State Board of Optometry to give an examination to any person who is a veteran of armed forces, has been licensed to practice optometry in another State, has received certificate of discharge from armed forces, and has been granted exemption from an institution of optometry accredited by the Board and to issue a certificate if he receives a passing grade in such examination.

Educational Assistance Chapter 175 provides that a school shall not be regarded as a suitable institution of learning for veteran educational benefits if over 85 per cent of its students are receiving federal educational benefits under the Government in acquiring a home and otherwise meets the requirements of the present veteran's exemption. The exemption thus authorized would be in lieu of the present veteran's exemption. This proposed amendment must be voted upon by the people at the 1954 General Election, Nov. 2, 1954. If the amendment is adopted, then Chapter 1219 goes into effect. This is a law accomplishing the results permitted by the above amendment.

What Makes You Think There's A Mind Reader Behind You?

If the fellow driving the car behind yours is a mind reader, you're safe without making signals. Unfortunately for you, less than one tenth of one per cent of the population is made up of professional mind readers.

So you'd better assume that other drivers haven't the slightest idea what you're about to do—stop, slow down, turn left or turn right. A shocking number of all accidents are caused by slowing, stopping or turning without proper signals. That's why you can often prevent an accident by making the proper signals—letting other drivers know, unmistakably, what you plan to do.

Specific hand signals are recommended in the Uniform Vehicle Code. In the event signals in your state differ from these, by all means learn correct signals and use them.

The recommended signal for slowing down, is the left hand out and straight down, palm to the rear—moving from side to side such affidavits to the precinct boards and the voter may vote. These provisions expire on the 31st day after final adjournment of the 1955 regular session of the Legislature.

Classes Resume At PV College

Campus classes resumed at Palos Verdes College on Monday, after the return of the entire lower division student body from the Mexican travel program. Examinations to determine the extent to which the students profited educationally from the travel experience are now being held, after which all classes will continue on the regular schedule. Also returned to campus classes are the upper division students, who during the past two weeks have scattered to various sources of study for the individual projects which have occupied their time during this same period. The next travel study will take place during the spring semester, when the lower division visits the state capital.

Look Both Ways Or Grab Harp, CHP Chief Says

"Don't walk yourself to death." Though the advice is simple, the California Highway Patrol reveals that 827 Californians failed to heed it and paid with their lives last year. Most common fallacy in human judgment, as indicated by the survey, was failure to look both ways before crossing streets or highways.

"Almost four of every ten pedestrians killed met death by dangerous mid-block crossings," commented E. R. Caldwell, Patrol commissioner.

"Pedestrians must remember their responsibility to obey the traffic regulations. They must also be constantly on the alert for the mistakes that too many motorists make," he added.

Caldwell listed the following important points for all pedestrians to follow:

- 1. Always walk facing traffic if no sidewalks are provided.
2. Wear or carry something white when walking at night.
3. Use crosswalks whenever possible.
4. When the light turns green be sure that all cross traffic has stopped before you start across the street.
5. Always look both ways before stepping off the curb.
6. Be constantly aware of the danger that exists until you reach the far curb.
