A milestone for the year has been reached by South Bay Chapter No. 92, Torrance, of the Disabled American Veterans, which has surpassed last year's membership enrollment with a total of 71 members as of May 1. As of May 1 the DAV national membership was 185,123, an all-time high. This is the 13th consecutive year the DAV has reached a new national membership record.

In a message to local disabled veterans, Howard W. Watts of Indianapolis, DAV national commander, urged every disabled veteran, regardless of the degree of disability, to join the DAV. "Through his active support he can not only protect his own rights," he said, "but will be doing his part in safeguarding our much needed program of rehabilitation. This program includes the finest hospital and medical care, adequate compensation based on present day cost of living, vocational training and job placement."
