

# State Okays Addition to Steam Plant

Construction by the Southern California Edison Company of a \$27,671,700 steam plant for generation of electric power, adjoining the present one at Redondo Beach was authorized today by the State Public Utilities Commission.

Also, the Commission granted SCEC permission to build another steam plant at El Segundo to cost an estimated \$28,895,300.



# New Legislation On Water Fought

Voices of Metropolitan Water District officials boomed forth this week with emphatic opposition to four bills now pending in Congress which, if enacted, "would adversely affect the lives and property of Southern Californians."

A resolution adopted by the board of directors Wednesday states that construction of large reservoirs and irrigation works in the upper Colorado River Basin, as contemplated under

Eighteen local residents were among more than 3000 USC seniors honored at formal commencement exercises yesterday at Alumni Memorial Park on campus. President Fred D. Fagg Jr. presided at the 71st annual event.

Five Torrance men, Arthur Anderson, Earl W. Eckert, Lloyd Jones, Edward Schwartz, and Richard Bankworth, received the master of science in education degree.

Bachelor of science in education went to three localities, Bruce Benton Gordon, Milt on Newell Miller, and Mary Ann Morey.

Senate Bills 1555 and 964, and House Bills 449 and 236, would be based on erroneous estimates as to water available for the projects if proper interpretation is to be given the Colorado River compact.

The resolution emphasizes that millions of people in Southern California have established their lives and economy upon assurance of retaining their share of Colorado River water in accordance with the compact.

**Serious Matter**

Adoption of the proposed legislation would be adverse to their interest, the directors said, and the matter is so serious that municipalities and public agencies are being requested to transmit resolutions to members of Congress opposing the bills.

Sufficient funds have been raised to insure operation of the West Basin barrier until June 30, Ralph W. Pritchard, chairman, reported. Plans are being made by the Flood Control District to test Hyperion effluent as a source of supply for the ultimate barrier against intrusion of sea water.

Test is part of the Zone II program and will occupy an area of about five acres in the southeast corner of the Hyperion plant.


## Private Enrolls In Missile School
