

Slate \$4 Million For New Schools

Over four million dollars worth of school construction and improvements will be undertaken during the 1954-55 fiscal year of Torrance Unified School District, according to a tentative building fund budget approved Tuesday night by the Board of Education.

Expenditures of \$3,560,948, plus an additional \$453,634 allocated under Federal Building Public Law 815 are slated for the expansion program, which includes five proposed new schools, improvements at three, and 25 portable classrooms.

Local taxpayers will bear the brunt of the cost, for a million and a half will come from the sale of bonds, approved in election last April, after July 1. Remainder of the three million dollar figure is cash in the county treasury and treasury bonds.

An expected additional \$178,000 of the recent \$55,000,000 nationwide appropriation for schools made by the federal government will swell the Public Law 815 fund here.

Apply for More Board passed a resolution Tuesday re-applying for the additional cash. "We can get a possible \$250,000," Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of Torrance Unified Schools, said, "but the \$178,650 is a sound estimate."

Additional grants under the recent \$55,000,000 nationwide appropriation for schools made by the federal government could swell Public Law 815 funds by \$250,000.

Board members passed a resolution Tuesday applying for the cash to supplement existing building monies. "While we may not get the entire \$250,000, we will get a chunk of it," Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of the Torrance Unified School District, said.

Del Amo Blvd. Called One of Worst Roads

Del Amo Blvd., which cuts through Torrance as 203rd St., was listed this week by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn as one of the most critically deficient major roads in Los Angeles County as he outlined plans to sponsor a huge bond issue to improve the entire county road system.

Among the 800 miles of major roads and secondary highways for the improvement of which Hahn stated are now critically deficient, Del Amo Blvd. from Pacific Coast Hwy. to the Orange County line was included.

The supervisor stated plans to sponsor a \$402,000,000 bond issue for the improvement of the roads. "We cannot concentrate all our efforts on freeways in the hope of solving our critical traffic situation. Freeways take too long to build and are too costly," he said.

He added that, with only \$7,000,000 a year for construction and improvement, the county can only improve a few miles each year. "The bond issue to be on the November ballot is to let the people decide whether they want secondary highways and streets of major importance improved as soon as possible, or if they want to wait 40 or 50 years," he stated.
