She uses easy-to-fix recipes like Chicken Cacciatore for dinner. Daughters, JoAnn, home for the summer from Willamette University, Suzie, who is working this summer at the YMCA, and Penny, the "right-hand" to the cook all vouch for the delicious chicken dish.

"The best thing about it," says Mrs. Benard, "is that you can fix it the day before." The Torrance homemaker serves her favorite recipe with a vegetable, potato dish, salad and dessert.

Here is Mrs. Benard's recipe for CHICKEN CACCIATORE:

1 large fryer (cut up) 1 No. 2 can tomatoes
 3 bell peppers 1/2 tsp. oregano
 1/2 cup olive oil salt and pepper
 2 large onions

Saute the peppers and onions in the oil and then remove from the oil. Brown the chicken, add peppers and onions and spices. Pour tomatoes over mixture and simmer for two hours. Serves 6. The chicken stock is an excellent base for spaghetti sauce.
