


FUN for BOYS & GIRLS

Make a Woven Paper Fan
No matter how many electric fans are in the house, there's always need for the old-fashioned hand fan to stir up a little breeze on hot Summer days. I'm going to tell you kids how to make some of these fans for Mother, Grandmother and anyone else who'd be glad to have one.

The fan is woven of paper strips, then tacked to a handle as the boy has done in Figure 3. You'll need 12 strips of thick colored paper to make one fan.



Use four bright colors—orange, green, blue and purple will be a good combination. Each of four sheets nine by 11 inches in size should be cut lengthwise into six strips one and a half inches wide. This will produce 24 strips—six of each color and that's enough for two fans each nine inches square. Narrower strips will make smaller fans.

On the table place three green strips and three purple strips, tacking them as in Figure 1. Next, alternately weave three

orange and three blue strips across them as in Figure 2, passing the new strips over and under the original strips.

Tuck the loose ends of all the strips into the big woven square. This is done by folding each loose end to the opposite side of the mat and tucking it beneath the strip it crosses. In Figure 2 some of the ends have been tucked into place and others have not. If you put a bit of paste on each end it won't work loose.

The remaining step is to tack the mat to a stick, completing the fan.
