**Solar Battery Teaches Lesson**

Next, expose yourself to this light from above. Let it strike you directly and fully, even as the sunlight strikes the plates of the solar battery. Shy not away from spiritual matters. No one has ever become sun-tanned by sitting in the shade. No one can become spiritually strengthened without basking in spiritual sunlight.

Prayer, a moment of meditation, an hour for honest thought—any method is good so long as it places you directly and fully in the stream of spiritual consciousness. A few minutes set aside for a spiritual sunbath each day, will make a new person of you.

**Be Good Conductor**  
Third, you must be a good conductor. You must let this spiritual strength flow into others and into acts that will benefit others. A current that stands still is no current. A strength that remains unto itself will not endure. A true live-wire has a good connection with others. The greatest strength is that which lends strength to others.

We are each born with a built-in solar battery. We each possess a mechanism that draws power from Heaven for us to put to work here on earth. Even as the sun's magic rays fall on every lowly blade of grass and give it the warmth and strength to grow and succeed, so the miracle of spiritual blessing is poured upon each lowly mortal to enable him to aspire and to achieve.

Seek this blessing from above, absorb it fully, pass it on to others. It will provide you with DC, Direct Current, immediate strength whenever you need it.


**Church Plans New Building**
